Membership to the PTNA is currently based on a hierarchical model. There are a range of very affordable fee options available depending on your sites requirements, the size of the paediatric research campus (determined by research grant funding) or for individual trial needs. PTNA Membership fees cover the license fees for any members of staff at those institutions wishing to use WebSpirit to collect data and track their trials at a project, site or institutional level, plus access to training and other PTNA activities developed over time at reduced fees.
