Sydney Children's Hospitals Network Clinical Research Forums:

Our Project Officer, Jennifer Thompson and Database Manager, Michael Emamooden partnered with NSW Better Treatments 4 Kids (BT4K) research network to present on WebSpirit and the challenges in capturing clinical trial data in ways that meet regulatory requirements according to ICH-GCP and the National Statement. These took place at both Sydney Children's Hospital and the Children's Hospital at Westmead in February 2014.

Professor Chris Cowell - PTNA Host Site Committee Member

Director of Research, Sydney Children's Hospital Network, and Paediatric Endocrinologist, The Children's Hospital at Westmead, Professor Chris Cowell is a Conjoint Professor of the University of Sydney; staff specialist in paediatric endocrinology; and was Head of the Institute of Endocrinology and Diabetes from 2003-2010. He co-led the development of the Paediatric Trials Network Australia (PTNA) and hosts the PTNA Secretariat at the Children's Hospital at Westmead.

Chris's major current focus is in developing research strategies that will provide the most impact in improving health of young people. His own research interests are in prevention of metabolic effects of obesity and optimising bone health. Professor Cowell has >170 peer review publications. He has designed and conducted randomised controlled trials (RCT's) and an NHMRC part funded birth cohort study and is currently a Co-CI on a NHMRC funded longitudinal follow up study.

<u>Therapeutic Innovations Australia – PTNA Funding Application</u>

The PTNA submitted an application to TIA's Translating Health & Medical Research into Clinical Application through Enabling Capabilities (THMR) project in March 2014. Through this initiative TIA intends to provide salary support to capabilities such as the PTNA and Webspirit that were funded through the preceding research infrastructure project. TIA received 18 submissions for funding under this THMR NCRIS 2013 project and TIA's NCRIS Expert Advisory Committee will meet shortly to review funding requests. An announcement of outcomes will be made in May.

COMBAT CF: A Phase 3, multi-centre, randomised, placebo-controlled study of azithromycin in the primary prevention of radiologically-defined bronchiectasis in infants with cystic fibrosis. Lead Site: Queensland Children's Medical Research

Rap-CV: Phase I study of Vinorelbine, Cyclophosphamide and Rapamycin for Recurrent Malignancies in Children. Lead site: The Children's Hospital at Westmead

ZAP: Bisphosphonate Treatment in Childhood Femoral Head Avascular Necrosis due to Perthes Disease. Lead site: The Children's Hospital at Westmead.

DMD: Clinical trial of Zoledronic acid (Aclasta) in children and adolescents with Duchenne muscular dystrophy. Lead site: Murdoch Children's' Medical Research Institute.
